#### Introduction

This policy statement sets out North East Futures UTC's arrangements for managing the access of providers to students at the UTC for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

Student entitlement

All students (in Years 10-13) are entitled:

- to find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of
  a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training
  options available at each transition point;
- to hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options events, assemblies and group discussions and taster events;
- to understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

## Management of provider access requests - Procedure

A provider wishing to request access should contact the North East Futures UTC's reception and ask to speak to the Admissions Manager

## Opportunities for access

A number of events, integrated into the UTC's careers programme, will offer providers an opportunity to go into the UTC to speak to students and/or their parents/carers:

#### Premises and facilities

North East Futures UTC will make the main hall, classrooms or private meeting rooms available for discussions between the provider and students, as appropriate to the activity. The UTC will also make available AV and other specialist equipment to support provider presentations. This will all be discussed and agreed in advance of the visit with the Careers Leader or a member of their team.

Providers are welcome to leave a copy of their prospectus or other relevant course literature at reception.

## Monitoring and Evaluation

The Board and Principal will monitor the operation and effectiveness of North East Futures UTC's Policy Statement on Provider Access.
